Silver Oak's annual donation drive is our main fundraising activity and this year, Our goal is to raise **\$20,000 towards Technology** and Science materials. We've started buying more iMacs for the Computer Lab, as well as more Chrome Books, the goal being to have one Chrome Book per student. We are getting much closer, but we need your help to get to the finish line. For Science, many supplies are needed to cover our 4 year curriculum (Environmental Science, Biology, Physics, and Chemistry). With that in mind, some work has already been done in the Science classroom, such as new electrical wiring, installation of the emergency eye wash and shower, and safety cabinets for storing flammable and corrosive products. Diverse materials (microscopes, balances, chemicals, droppers, test tubes, dissection guides, and also supplies for physics, biology books) have been ordered, however, as you know, science experiments require many more materials!

Latest Updates

Silver Oak is continuing to grow, from 160 students to 190 this year! Ms. Blasi's team is now comprised of 12 teachers, a Special Education coordinator, an Academic Dean/College Counselor, a Dean of Students and an Office Manager. Here's an update on our LCAP goals to improve the Conditions of Learning:

Goals to improve the Conditions of Learning	Status
1- Provide staff with Montessori Secondary I/ II Training	Have 16 staff members (working with the students), 5 already completed their Montessori Secondary I/ II, 9 are in progress and 1 is completing Montessori administrators credential.
2- Be in a safe facility	Discussion with the YMCA to obtain more space. In addition to outdoor work, all lights will be replaced with LEDs, and windows security film installed. Cleanup days and painting refresh will happen this winter.
3- College Readiness	Continue to have our college counselor full-time, especially that we have more seniors! Offering Honors classes and after school tutoring. Make sure students get all their credits, and are prepared for the standardized tests.
4- Offer more electives	Our expanded team of teachers is offering more electives, with different choices.
5- Develop a full athletic program	Silver Oak continues to be part of BACSAC (Bay Area Charter Schools Athletic Conference) and has five sport teams.
