- 1. **School Renewal:** in 2017-2018, we will submit a new petition to seek approval for another 5 years. Having a high percentage of parent feedback will show HUSD, our authorizer that parents are engaged and care about Silver Oak High School.
- 2. Changes: your feedback helps us draft our LCAP (and Strategic Plan), to confirm areas to improve.
- 3. **Spending:** your feedback influences how to allocate funding in the most beneficial way for the students.
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Since 2013-2014 school year, California schools are being funded, using the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). With this new funding strategy, schools are more flexible in how to allocate funds (it is not earmarked); but each school needs to develop a Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP). The LCAP is an accountability plan that aligns the school's financial resources with its educational goals and outcomes.

In the past years, those goals were based on the Eight State Priority Areas adopted by the State Board of Education; now a Dashboard is being developed, using state and local indicators. Each school defines goals, associated spending and how students' performance will be enhanced, by providing additional services to all students, including English Learners, students eligible for Free and Reduced-Price Meals and Foster Youths.

Stakeholder inputs are an important part of the process and include parents, students, and staff. We would like to hear your view of the education at Silver Oak High School, so that we can keep improving. Any feedback is valued.
