Students will develop a greater working knowledge of music and the theory of western notation



overview

This course seeks to build upon the working knowledge of music and the theory of western classical music. Students will explore the concepts of music notation, chord progressions, intervals, rhythm and meter, and many more musical concepts. Students will listen to many different styles and genres of music to gain a greater understanding of music theory concepts. Students will also focus on building their skills as a musician in one

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instrument of choice. Also students will incorporate their expanding knowledge into creating and performing original music.

_____ **Music Notation or Musical Element**- Students will choose to complete 1 of 2 assignments below.

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1. Music Notation- Students will create and label a chromatic scale using a treble clef chart and a bass clef chart. Students will also create and label all musical notes located on a piano.

2. Musical Elements- Students will create a project which focuses on the elements of music. Within their project students will define each musical element and give an example of each musical element found in a recorded music piece.

Elements of music: rhythm, harmony, melody, dynamics, texture, form, tone color

Due date September 20, 2017

Music Instrument Focus- Each student will choose a music instrument they want to focus on building their skills in for the semester. Students will submit why they chose their instrument, what experience they have with their instrument, and how they plan to build their skills in their chosen instrument. Students are encouraged to pick an instrument they have access to because they will be required to practice their instrument through out the semester while documenting their progress. Students are encouraged to begin practicing their instrument as often as possible.
