essential understanding

You want a banana! Which one? This one or that one? Demonstrative adjectives and demonstrative pronouns help to clarify which one. In English, demonstrative adjectives and pronouns are identical. In Spanish, they also are identical with the exception of a written accent mark over demonstrative pronouns. And of course, in Spanish, they must agree in number and gender with the nouns they replace or modify, just like other adjectives in Spanish.

Overview

In this unit, we will study Demonstrative Adjective and Pronouns in Spanish. Demonstrative adjectives are used to "point out" objects or people and "demonstrate" the spatial relationship between the speaker and the object. That is, they identify how close something is to another noun or pronoun. For example, "This bread is as fresh as that bread." Pronouns take the place of nouns. So, what are demonstrative pronouns? Demonstrative pronouns look just like demonstrative adjectives except that they have a written accent mark on the first é. The accent replaces the noun.

Guiding question 1:

¿Cómo se usan los pronombres demostrativos en español? (How are demonstrative pronouns used in Spanish?)
