TB asked CP, LH and DW to support him with moving this forward. MB also volunteered to assist.

6) Discussion Items

- a) Material Revision EB informed Board that we have not yet submitted this, however it is ready for submission and she will keep Board informed as to when it is submitted.
- b) Update on 238 corridor project HE updated the Board on the community meeting she attended in relation to this project on 14th March. HE outlined the different parcels of land and which ones had which plans associated with them. Parcel 3 has a proposal that includes a Charter School which HE had advised EB of and EB followed up. HE also had passed info on to Red Hook with respect to another parcel. HE said there will be further meetings for different parcels and she will continue to attend these. TB thanked HE for attending.
- c) Committees TB outlined his view that there should be a clear division between strategic committees that are Board committees and operational committees which should remain with the school. CP outlined his concerns that there should be uniformity in terms of how committees operate and the format of committees having a mission and goals should be good practice. LH suggested building on this with terms of reference for all committees that outline reporting period. frequency of meetings as was done for the executive committee. EB said that in her experience of previous Boards there was a standard template for reporting. MB raised concerns that there was currently no active fundraising committee and this needs to be addressed urgently. Also that although the day to day facilities business could be managed by a school facilities committee there should also be another committee reporting to the Board in terms of a new facility for the school. EB as advisor to board (not as Principal) suggested the Board needed a governance, finance and fundraising committee, that it was logical and usual for the treasurer to chair the finance committee and for the Chair to be on all committees. She also suggested that although we have a separate nominations committee, and this seems to work because the governance committee has a large workload because of being a charter school, often nominations falls within the remit of governance. A capital campaign committee would usually be an adhoc committee. HE, suggested missions should be attached to each committee, and that defined responsibilities to be clearer. CP suggested we need clarity that a board member role is strategic not operational and should have a document outlining this which is about teaching board members about their role.
