Continue learning the Mac lab its tools and Photoshop CC. Begin learning the Elements of Art.

Overview

Students will explore the Elements of Art and how they are used to create successful and effective works of art both digital and traditional.

Students will design, develop and present their work while learning digital citizenship and responsibility.

- It is **your** responsibility to keep up with assigned material and communicate to me any issues that would cause you to fall behind.

Group WORK

1. Elements presentation/lesson/: In your groups of 3 (same as science) you will choose one element to thoroughly research and “report on”. Your report will consist of a presentation style lesson for the entire class that includes 1) examples, 2) definition and an 3) explanation of how your element is used in typical art work. Each member must find or make an 1) example (image) and each member must find a 2) definition. Each member must also 3) explain how the element is used in the example.

Tip: while researching make sure to look for your element as it relates to art (example value has a different meaning if your search for it without adding: value the element of art)

2. Elements of Art Cards

Using Photoshop you will be creating 7 separate cards illustrating the elements of art.

Each card must contain the following in their design:

1. Name of the Element
2. Definition of the Element
3. Design illustrating the element in action (see sample)
4. Use colors and designs that utilize the element (not a random design that does not relate to the element)
5. Once each member has created their element you will put it all together in final product of your choice.

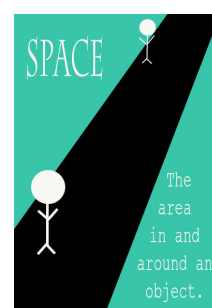
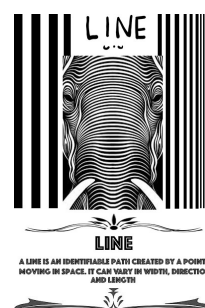
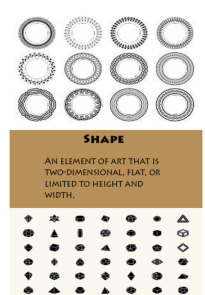
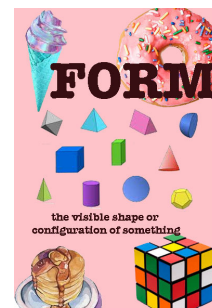

Size of art cards should be 400 width x 600 height

72 Resolution Pixels/Inch

Background (white or transparent)



- *Each student must create a minimum of two of the cards as well as contributing to the final product in some way.*
- *Everyone must represent each element in some creative way- Due Oct 10 & 11*

A note about .psd and .jpg

.psd is your raw photoshop file that remains editable while a .jpg is a compressed version that is smaller but no longer in photoshop form. You should always save a .psd version of everything you do in case you need to re-work it. Please save this in you google drive school account for easy access.
