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4) Items for Joint Meeting

a) Capital Campaign Work Group update

There are 3 possible choices.

- Continue with the capital campaign, as it is, no change.
- Pause the capital campaign (which is paid until March 31st), but Campbell will continue working on the deliverables until April.
- Cancel the contract, until September.

Red Hook will feel more comfortable if capital campaign is paused.

Individual donors won't give to capital campaign at this point. Instead, operational giving will mostly be happening. The way should be to reach out to corporations and foundations to start building relationships. Then they may be more willing to give later towards the capital campaign. Campbell is working with Joy for developing an operating plan to position ourselves with those donors.

Comments and questions:

- Can the in-progress brochure be finished, to be ready when the campaign resumes?
- Goal is to purchase the property. However stopping the capital campaign will not affect the purchase; it may just delay the construction of the secondary building. Possibility to look also at other funding opportunities, to buy Red Hook out.
- Environment has changed in the last 30 days. Even if willingness is present, there is less capacity with the stock market down. The state of California is severely impacted. We have to be realistic about our revenues, and should not even count on operating giving.
- Brochure is focusing on preschool with raising 30 million for that purpose, but unsure about this number; and 10 million for the new building. Explanation is that adding a new building doesn't generate many excitements, if donors want to really make an impact. Partnering with a training program, changing the education model, is something very positive.

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c) Material revision Work Group update

- Not yet submitted. Mostly tomorrow Friday April 3rd or Monday April 6th. Young & Minney notified us that the articles of incorporation and bylaws needed to be modified for changing the grades described and the school name. Now they say to revert the school name change. Suggest looking if both materials should be submitted. Recommendation to submit only the material revision for the merger, and do the one for the preschool later, when ready to start. Otherwise material revision could be delayed. Lawyer is Kim Rodriguez.
- Can we merge without HUSD approval? No, due to our governance model. How are schools affected financially? Need to look at both budget. Is HUSD obligated to respond to us? Elaine to continue to ask for a meeting with Lisa Davies.

d) Facility Work Group update

Red Hook is financially committed. Ratcliff's proposal is still more expensive. Ratcliff reduced their proposal substantially to the point where they no longer would be able to deliver the project to their client's satisfaction. Even though Ratcliff completed many projects in the Bay Area on time and on schedule, Red Hook believed, that they would need to hire a consulting company to oversee Ratcliff's budget management. So Red Hook felt more comfortable to work with BCA. The difference in the proposed architects' proposals would be used to improve the budget for additional features that could be requested by GO & SO. It was Red Hook's decision, but they wanted our consensus. Purchase price of property is locked in.

e) Campus closures & distance learning update

- Golden Oak update:
 - On Friday March 13th, solidified decision to close both schools. Elementary school cannot turn around in 24 hours. Jen listened to the CDE and state officials' recommendations. Researched how to specialize instructions.
 - Week 2: Figured out chrome books, and internet. 45 chrome books lended to students. Once platform was readied, teachers had to practice. Using Google suite, which was first used by MS. Also followed training from AMS.
 - Week 3: Developed staff member weekly schedule. Maintained structure of communication. Teachers are practicing giving individual lessons.
 - Students start their distance learning on April 6th.
- Silver Oak update:
 - Distance learning was implemented quickly. Already have one to one Chromebook for each student. There were some internet issues. SPED had follow

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up one on one. Mental health was extended with therapy for at-risk individual. Students are not always happy to be home, some have to babysit. First original schedule was followed, but it turns out to be too much online time for students & teachers. Now schedule is only mornings, with individual work in the afternoon. Using Zoom, and upgraded google classrooms.

- Seniors: Advisors named 6 seniors to represent their class. Discuss what and how to make it special. Work on a digital yearbook every Friday. Students asked to submit images, videos of home learning. Plan an alternative senior trip (as it was cancelled). They want a live graduation (not virtual), even if it is this summer.
- Use as a model for next year if needed to happen again (virus cycle). Great level of collaboration has been demonstrated by both schools. SO continues to take attendance at every class. The grading system stays the same, with assignments indicated on study guides. No SAT, nor CASPP tests. Not a problem as already using multiple measures of evaluation.
- => Business as usual.

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
